Our Speakers

Candela Bonaccorso, PsyD, is a clinical psychologist and psychoanalyst. She is a graduate of the William Alanson White Institute's psychoanalytic training program. She is currently the President of the Institute's Psychoanalytic Society which is the alumni association of the psychoanalytic training program. In that role, she developed the current colloquium series entitled "The Embodied Psychoanalyst". Dr. Bonaccorso completed the NYU-Bellevue pre-doctoral internship in 2007, where she remained on staff at a dual diagnosis clinic and subsequently at the World Trade Center Mental Health Program. While at Bellevue, she provided individual and group psychotherapy to Spanish- and English-speaking patients and she supervised psychology interns, externs, social workers, and psychiatry residents until 2012, when she departed from Bellevue and transitioned to private practice. Her office is located in Manhattan.

Sandra Buechler, PhD, is a Training and Supervising Analyst at the William Alanson White Institute. She is the author of *Clinical Values: Emotions that Guide Psychoanalytic Treatment*, (Analytic Press, 2004), *Making a Difference in Patients' Lives*, (Routledge, 2008), which won the Gradiva Award, *Still Practicing: The Heartaches and Joys of a Clinical Career*, (Routledge, 2012), *Understanding and Treating Patients in Clinical Psychoanalysis: Lessons from Literature*, (Routledge, 2015) *Psychoanalytic Reflections: Training and Practice*, (IPBooks, 2017) *Psychoanalytic Approaches to Problems in Living*, (Routledge, 2019) and *Poetic Dialogues* (IPBooks, 2021).

Jack Drescher, MD, is a psychiatrist and psychoanalyst in private practice in New York City. Dr. Drescher is Clinical Professor of Psychiatry at Columbia University and a Faculty Member at Columbia's Division of Gender, Sexuality, and Health. He is a Senior Psychoanalytic Consultant at Columbia's Center for Psychoanalytic Training and Research and Adjunct Professor at New York University's Postdoctoral Program in Psychotherapy and Psychoanalysis. He is a Training and Supervising Analyst at the William Alanson White Institute.

Dr. Drescher is a Distinguished Life Fellow of the American Psychiatric Association, Past President of the Group for Advancement of Psychiatry and a Past President of APA's New York County Psychiatric Society. He presently serves as a corresponding member on APA's Council on Communications.

Dr. Drescher is Author of *Psychoanalytic Therapy and the Gay Man* (Routledge) and Emeritus Editor of the *Journal of Gay and Lesbian Mental Health*. He has edited and co-edited more than a score of books dealing with gender, sexuality and the health and mental health of LGBT communities. He has authored and co-authored numerous professional articles and book chapters as well. His publications have been translated into Italian, Portuguese, French, Spanish, Russian, Arabic, Finnish and German. Dr. Drescher is an expert media spokesperson on issues related to gender and sexuality and has appeared on major news outlets in the United States and abroad.

Alejandra Plaza Espinosa, PhD, is a psychologist from Universidad Intercontinental (UIC). She has a Master's in Clinical Psychology from UNAM and a PhD in Psychoanalytic Research from IIPCS and a Ph.D. in Psychoanalysis from UIC, (*Finished credit*). Dr. Espinosa has a private practice in Mexico City. She is the former President of IARPP Mexico and a founding member of the chapter. Currently, she is on the Mexico Chapter's Board of Directors. She was President of the Institute of Research in Clinical and Social Psychology and was coordinator of the Academic Board of the same Institute. She was a member of the Editorial Committee of *Aletheia Journal of Psychology and Psychoanalysis*. Together with Dr. Joan Coderch, she co-authored the book *Emotion and Human Relations, Relational Psychoanalysis as a Social Therapeutic*. (2016). She has authored many articles and is co-author of other psychoanalytic books. Dr. Espinosa has been professor at Universidad Intercontinental, Universidad del Claustro de Sor Juana, Universidad de las Américas y Universidad del Valle de México.

Irwin Hirsch, PhD, is faculty, supervisor and former director, Manhattan Institute for Psychoanalysis and Distinguished visiting faculty at the William Alanson White Institute. He is also Adjunct Clinical Professor of Psychology and Supervisor, Postdoctoral Program in Psychotherapy and Psychoanalysis, New York University and is faculty & supervisor, The National Training Program, The National Institute of the Psychotherapies. Dr. Hirsch is author of over 90 psychoanalytic articles and book chapters and 6 books: the 2008 Goethe Award winning, *Coasting in the Countertransference: Conflicts of Self-Interest between Analyst and Patient*, (Routledge); *The Interpersonal*

Tradition: The Origins of Psychoanalytic Subjectivity, (Routledge, 2015). He co-edited with Donnel Stern, *The Interpersonal Perspective in Psychoanalysis, 1960's – 1990's: Rethinking Transference and Countertransference*, (Routledge, 2017); and also co-edited with Donnel Stern, *Further Developments in Interpersonal Psychoanalysis, 1980s-2010s: Evolving Interest in the Analyst's Subjectivity* (Routledge, 2018); *More Human than Otherwise: Selected Papers*, (IP Books, 2019); and co-edited with Phillip Blumberg & Robert Watson, *Psychoanalytic Perspectives on Intense Involvement in Sports*. (Routledge, 2020). He serves on the editorial boards of *Contemporary Psychoanalysis*, *Psychoanalytic Dialogues*, and *Psychoanalytic Perspectives*.

Ira Moses, PhD, ABPsa, is a Training and Supervising Analyst; and is former Director of Training and former Director of Clinical Services, of the William Alanson White Institute. He is on the faculty of the Western New England Psychoanalytic Institute and is Visiting Faculty of the San Diego Psychoanalytic Center, former Board Member of the China American Psychoanalytic Alliance, and is on the faculty of the Russian Intensive Psychodynamic Program. Dr. Moses is a Member of the International Psychoanalytic Association (IPA), and a former member of the Board of Directors of the American Psychoanalytic Association. He has published articles entitled, *Misuse of Empathy, Anonymity and Self Disclosure*, and *The Analyst's Resistance to Asking Questions*.

Helen Quinones, PhD, is a licensed psychologist and psychoanalyst with a private practice in New York City. She is a Psychoanalytic Supervisor and faculty at William Alanson White Institute and is Clinical Consultant at New York University Postdoctoral Program. She has published in *Contemporary Psychoanalysis* and in the International Federation of Psychoanalytic Society's *Espacio Psicanalitico*. Dr. Quinones has been a Presenter at the annual meetings of the American Psychological Association/Division 39, and the American Orthopsychiatry.
